Cathedral and local photographer combine to produce Fundraising calendar for 2007

Having successfully launched their first fundraising calendar last year, Truro Cathedral has gone into partnership with a local photographer, to produce a second stunning calendar.

This second calendar features seasonal scenes that highlight the beauty of Cornish land and seascapes. The images are dramatic and varied, and are expertly shot by local photographer, Philip Trevennen of Penzance, "I was delighted to help the Cathedral when they approached me with this idea for a joint project. I supply the Cathedral Shop with cards of my photographic images, and that is where the idea for a calendar came from. I've been a professional photographer since 1990 after being motivated by a round the world trip. Coming back to Cornwall I was inspired by the fantastic quality of light and the variety of landscape to start a photographic career. I've held exhibitions of my work all over the world, including China where my photographs made the front pages!! The Cathedral is a wonderful building and I am only too glad to help raise funds for its restoration." The Calendar, which has been produced by Rowes of Hayle, will be on sale in the Cathedral Shop and at a limited number of retail outlets.

The Dean of Truro, Christopher Hardwick, is delighted with the quality and design of the calendar, "It really is an impressive piece of collaboration between Philip and the Cathedral. Being new to Cornwall I am only just beginning to discover its breathtaking delights. Phillip's images really capture that special quality of light and landscape that makes Cornwall such an extraordinary place to live." James Barker, the Cathedral Shop Manager, is very pleased with the new calendar, "This is very different to last years calendar, which featured the story of the restoration of the West Front. It is much more a calendar of Cornwall. This is a

very busy time for us with lots of visitors to the Cathedral. I think they are going to love it, - I hope they're going to love it! We think that locals will also want to buy it, to send as Christmas presents to friends and relations around the world, its got a lot of appeal.”
